This term overview outlines the work units that will be studied, along with the activities that have been planned to support learning in the classroom. Below are the units we will be studying this term.

This term overview outlines the work units that will be studied, along with the activities that have been planned to support the learning in the classroom. Below are the units we will be studying this term.



#### English

Messages and Morals

Students in Year 3 and 4 will read and analyse traditional stories from Asia and from Aboriginal Peoples' and Torres Strait Islander Peoples' histories and cultures. They demonstrate understanding of the stories by identifying structural and language features, finding literal and inferred meaning and explaining the message or moral.

#### Mathematics

Students develop understandings of:

#### Year 3

- > Number and place value.
- Chance and data.
- > Money value and simple change.
- > Measurement, length, mass, capacity.
- > Time to the nearest minute.
- > Addition and subtraction (including regrouping).
- > Multiplication and division.



Data representation and interpretation - write questions to collect data, collect and record data, display and interpret data.

Patterns and algebra - investigate and describe number patterns, solve word problems and use equivalent multiplication / division number sentences to find unknown quantities.

- Number and place value calculate addition and subtraction using a range of mental and written strategies, recall multiplication and related division facts, calculate multiplication and division using a range of mental and written strategies, solve problems involving the four operations.
- Money and financial mathematics calculate change to the nearest five cents, solve problems involving purchases.
- Using units of measurement (volume, time) measure and compare volume, use am and pm notation, solve simple time problems.
  - Number and place value use estimation and rounding, apply mental strategies, add, subtract, multiply and divide 2 and 3 digit numbers.

#### Science

#### Year 3 What's the matter?



In this unit, students will investigate heat and heat transfer. Students will evaluate how adding or removing heat affects materials in everyday life.

#### Year 4 Fast Forces

Students investigate how forces affect objects through direct contact or from a distance, and relate this knowledge to the use of forces in everyday life.

#### HASS

#### **Civics and Citizenship**

In this unit, students in Year 3 and 4 will examine the purpose of laws and distinguish between rules and laws. They will explore the diversity of different groups in their local community and consider how personal identity is shaped by aspects of culture, and by the groups to which they belong.

### Health

Students in Year 3 and 4 will learn and understand how heritage and culture influence identity. They will demonstrate communication skills and strategies for working cooperatively and observe varying emotional responses.

#### Visual Arts

Students in Year 3 and 4 will participate in various visual arts activities in Term 4. Christmas craft will be a focus later in the term.



#### **Human Movement**

#### Drama

Students will participate in one 30 minute lesson per week. In this unit, students will continue to explore Indigenous viewpoints through freeze frames and small scene creations. Students will also respond to their own work presented in class as well as others.

#### **Physical Education**

Students will have one 30 minute Physical Education lesson each week. They will participate in AFL, skipping and Newcombe.

#### Japanese

Students will continue to develop their existing knowledge and skills relating to the Japanese language and culture. Learning will focus on:

- · Describing a storybook character.
- · Developing students` understanding of hiragana.

#### Music

Students in Year 3 and 4 receive a half hour lesson with Ms Woodruff. They are continuing to build a repertoire of songs that include more complex rhythmic and melodic elements. The students are learning to play these on either classroom tuned percussion (Year 3) or recorder (Year 4).



#### Interschool Sport (Years 4 – 6)

Students can participate in interschool sport. Students will be involved in 4 x Friday afternoon sporting sessions. Dates – 14, 21,28 October and 4 November. For Year 4 students this term the District is offering an Interschool Sport program - Year 4 Multi-Sport. Year Four students will learn the skills and play games against students from other schools in seven different sports over the scheduled four weeks. Sports include, Touch Football, AFL, Basketball, Hockey, Cricket and other ball sports (TBA).

#### Junior Badge

Students in Year 3 can continue working towards achieving their Junior Badge this term. Students intending to nominate for Student Councillor in Year 4 will need to have achieved their Junior Badge by <u>Friday 25 November 2022</u>. Reminder that it is your child's responsibility to approach their classroom teacher.



# **Big Bang Science Show**

Year 4's have the exciting opportunity to expand on their Term 4 Science unit on forces with an incursion hosted by Big Bang Education across Week 2 and 3. The 'Forces in Action' show and workshops will allow students to learn about forces from local science professionals who will share their expertise and knowledge with hands on experiments to challenge students critical thinking skills.
