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## Yr 5 Street Science!



On Tuesday 24 May the Year Five's had a 'Seriously Fun Science Experience' from the Street Science Team. During the incursion in our school Hall the students were able to explore how light is absorbed, reflected and refracted. The team set up four stations for small groups of students to enjoy a hands-on experience to discover the amazing science behind light. Worksheets were completed and then followed up in class. The finale of the day was the exciting 'See

the Light' Show. During the show the students witnessed first hand the properties of light right before their eyes. High impact demonstrations with fire, liquid nitrogen and other curious chemicals were also observed in an unforgettable lesson on how light and matter behave around us. Our teachers then, together, review the unit of work to identify opportunities to differentiate the learning to support all students to achieve their best. While our teachers are away from their class for the day, curriculum collaborations have a positive impact on students' achievement and learning outcomes, which are referred to in the next newsletter article below. Well done to our teaching teams.

## Semester 1, 2022 Results

Our semester 1, 2022 report cards will be emailed out to > parents and carers at the end of this term. Teachers are currently meeting with parents and carers to discuss students' semester 1 results. The schools overall results were outstanding and exceeded our targets for 2022. Our 2022 targets are:

## Targets for 2022:

- Increase the percentage of students from Prep to Year 6, achieving a C or better in the Australian Curriculum learning area of English. Target is 94% in 2022
- Increase the percentage of students from Prep to Year 6, achieving an A or B level of achievement in the Australian Curriculum learning area of English. Target is 55% in 2022.

We achieved in Semester 1, 2022 in English:

- 95.2% of our students achieved a pass (C standard or better) in English this semester
- 64.3% of our students achieved and A or B in English

Both of these results were well above our targets.

We also have a focus on our students achieving an A or B in English and we have seen an increase in these results this semester. Our percent of students achieving an A or B in English has increased by 3.7% from Semester 2, 2021 and increased by again 13.8% from Semester 1, 2021 in English achievement across the school.


