These last few weeks I have been visiting some Year 5 and 6 classrooms and working together with students on team building, personal strengths, kindness and social skills. The transition to adolescence can bring changes to established friendship groups

which bring new challenges to children and an opportunity to connectedness, kindness and that interactions between individuals can have a ripple effect on others.

Positive friendships can help young people feel like they belong at school and being with friends can encourage them to learn. Staff are continually modelling social and friendship skills at school.
