

Multi-Age Classes at McDowall State School

Multi-Age classes can be formed anywhere from Prep to Year 6. In Queensland, there are many schools that by design, Is the Planning Different for a multi-age class? implement mixed-age classes. Multi-age grouping is just one of the devices used to organise classrooms, deliberately mixing children from various age groups of more than one year in the one class. Multi-age groupings are also known by other terms, > e.g. composite, have been operating for many years and are common in our schools. In some cases the formation of a multiage class offers the best teacher/student ratio for quality teaching and learning. Reasonable teacher/ student ratios allow for frequent monitoring of learning, the development purposeful and precise learning goals and guality feedback for all students.

Your classroom teacher will moderate the standards of work with the relevant year level, to ensure consistency of teacher judgement for reporting purposes.

Yes the planning documents cater for both year levels.

- Sequencing of content across the year is adapted to ensure some level of consistency for both year levels being taught in the classroom e.g. Biological science taught in the same term . This may mean that units are covered in a different order to other classes in the school in that year level. The integrity of the standards is never compromised.
- Typically students attend specialist lessons as a multi-age class and specialist teachers adapt their sequence of learning in the same way the classroom teacher does.
