Standing Requirement: Disclosure of Interest and Indictable Offences

This applies to a member of the School Council if:

- The interested member has a direct or indirect financial interest in an issue being considered, or about to be considered by the School Council; and
- The interest could conflict with the proper performance of the interested member's duties when considering the issue.

As soon as practicable after the relevant facts come to the interested member's knowledge, the interested member must disclose the nature of the interest to a meeting of the School Council. Unless the School Council otherwise directs, the interested member must not be present when the School Council considers the issue or take part in a decision of the School Council about the issue. The interested member must not be present when the School Council is considering whether the interested member can be party to considerations.

If a member is not present at a School Council meeting due to their disclosure of interest, the School Council is still considered to have a quorum (as if the member were present) and the remaining members present would consider the issue. A disclosure of interest must be recorded in the School Council's meeting minutes.

If a person is convicted of an indictable offence while a member of a School Council, the person must give written notice to the Principal of the conviction within seven days after the conviction.

School Strategic Planning and Annual Implementation Plan which now includes I4S Time Allocated = 15 mins.

- o Imogen went through the school strategic plan and the annual implementation plan
- \circ The annual implementation plan outlines the more detailed focus of the School Strategic Plan
- Investing for Success (I4S) is now included in these plans
- Capability and development in STEM have been a focus (focusing on building cognitively engaging the students)
- Learning Walls are in place for all classrooms
- o Goal Setting and feedback is being worked on this year
- Have set slightly higher % targets in all areas across A-C for both maths and English
- o Noting students overall do better in maths hence the higher targets
- Monitoring the program in place midway point predications (at the end of each term) those achieving a D or lower are identified and flagged for needing additional support, Academic Case Management across all levels and vulnerable groups as well, meetings periodically to focus in on the AIP goals to ensure the right focus is going to the rights areas
- A very high level of moderation is happening across all areas, as well as cluster moderation with other nearby school and cross collaboration across all classes/teachers across each year level
- Well being, engagement and culture inclusion is the second priority, currently has been identified as underway and will now be given a more stronger focus this year, this is due to needing to ensure priority 1 was well underway first which has been identified as on track.
- A question was raised on how well being is being measured a well being (yr4-6) & student opinion (yr5-6) surveys are taken from all students each year, feedback from these surveys are reviewed
- A new program has been implemented this year called 'Play is the Way' which is working on overall well being and behaviours of the students
- Debriefing was mentioned as a really valuable way of working on each year levels overall wellbeing.

\checkmark School Budget Time Allocated = 5 mins.

- Projects that are being worked on this year F & G block will have a renovation this year, as well as a staff room upgrade (including kitchen)
- \$180k will go into Priority 1 Educational Achievement of AIP (\$90k per subject)
- P&C pay for the school chaplain \$50k
- Advancing STEM \$150k
- Portion of the Budget supports reducing the music fees to ensure there isn't a huge increase in these fees year on year – including reducing the y4 fee slightly due to the change up in how
