- Contribute to the success and wellbeing of all students through inclusive education supports.

Our initiatives include

- Engagement of all teaching staff in collaborative curriculum planning process of the Australian Curriculum and Moderation processes to ensure a deep understanding of the Australian Curriculum and its implementation.
- Deliver a Case Management process that focuses on professional multi-disciplined Year Level teams - collaborative approach across P-6 in (a) Knowing students and how they learn (b) Identifying barriers to learning (c) Leading Learning Pedagogical Alignment: Action research linked to performance development (d) Extending learning outcomes for **ALL** students (i) Focus on each child (ii) Ownership of the learning journey (iii) Goal setting (iv) Feedback
- Deliver a strong focus on the Australian Curriculum - Literacy General Capability - phonological awareness, vocabulary, decoding skills, robust language instruction and the communication skills of: listening, speaking, reading, spelling, grammar and punctuation; and writing.

Employing an experienced Speech Language Pathologist for three days each week to work within multi-disciplined professional teams P-6.	\$70,000
Employing additional Teacher Aide time 58.25hrs each week to focus on literacy and numeracy instruction while working within multi-disciplined professional teams P-6.	\$98,058
Employing additional Teacher time each week to enhance P-6 case management and collaborative curriculum planning including moderation and multi-disciplined professional team inquiries and strategies to enhance practices and resulting student achievement in the Australian curriculum.	\$130,328
